You are not expected to miss athletic practices/games/rehearsals/performances for Student Government but must remain in communication with Ms.

PROBATION

Officers will be placed on probation for the following:

- Insufficient GPA
- Unsatisfactory citizenship
- Conduct that reflects poorly on the school or Student Government
- Neglect of duties of office including a failure to reasonably attend meetings and other activities that are part of the position

The officer in question will be on probation for one report card period, until the problem is resolved or until the advisor deems terms have been met. During the probationary period, rights and privileges of an officer may be revoked. If requirements are not met thereafter, the officer may be permanently removed from office.






